Dear Parent/Carer,

Well done to the school choir and Anne Frank Trust Peer Guides who took part in the Holocaust Memorial Day Commemoration service at Sacred Heart last Friday. We were one of eleven Crosby schools who were present. Our Peer Guides read and our choir concluded the service with a rendition of 'Over the Rainbow'. Mr Dolan wrote a special arrangement of the song, which was sung in Yiddish, in the round with an ancient Hebrew blessing. It was a very moving occasion. As well as the Holocaust, it focussed on other, more recent genocides such as the ones that took place in Cambodia, Rwanda and the Balkans. The message was loud and clear – if we don't learn from our history we risk making the same tragic mistakes again. It was an important step in the children's spiritual, social, moral and cultural development. Also present were Bill Esterson MP, Margaret Carney (Chief Executive of Sefton Council) and Councillor Ian Moncur (Cabinet Member for Health & Wellbeing). They were all full of praise for the children.
